Head of Household: For unmarried people who paid over half the cost of keeping up a home for a qualifying person, such as a child or parent. Certain unmarried people who lived apart from their spouse for the last 6 months of 2006 may also be able to use this status.

* If you turned 65 on January 1, 2006, you are considered to be age 65 at the end of 2006.

** GROSS INCOME means all income you received in the form of money, goods, property, and services that is not exempt from tax including any income from sources outside the United States. DO NOT include social security benefits unless you are married filing a separate return and you lived with your spouse at any time in 2006.

*** If you did not live with your spouse at the end of 2006 (or on the date your spouse died) and your gross income was at least \$2,750 you must file a return regardless of age.
