

## **Campus Hazing Transparency & Biannual Report**

**June 2026**

In accordance with the Stop Campus Hazing Act (Pub. L. No. 118-173), signed into law on December 23, 2024, which amended the Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act, all colleges and universities are required to post and maintain public hazing incident transparency reports. These reports are intended to ensure accountability, raise awareness, and prevent future harm by providing clear documentation of hazing incidents on campus.

Whittier College publishes this report in compliance with the Stop Campus Hazing Act and applicable California state law. This report covers hazing incidents occurring at Whittier College's main campus in Whittier, California, as well as any off-campus locations where College-recognized organizations operate.

For purposes of this Report, "violations" means those instances where a student organization established or recognized by the College was found to have violated the College's Anti-Hazing Policy. The College will update the Campus Hazing Transparency Report on or before January 1 and August 1 of each year.

Pursuant to section 444 of the General Education Provisions Act (commonly known as the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974), personal identifying information of students has not been included in this report.

Annual statistics on hazing will be available in the College's Annual Security and Fire Safety Report. Please note that hazing statistics will be included beginning with the 2026 report (issued in 2027). Hazing statistics include incident reports that meet the federal definition of hazing in Section 485(f)(6)(A) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1092(f)(6)(A)). Such statistics do not reflect actual findings of hazing behavior, which are included in the Campus Hazing Transparency Report.
