# DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT PICES TRANSFER PATHWAY



The PICES Program allows transfer students to receive a Bachelor of Arts in Child Development and Education Specialist Credential in 2.5 years upon transferring in to Whittier College.

## Requirements:

- 37 transferrable credits worth of IGETC Courses, including:
  - 2 English Courses (6 units)
  - 1 Math Course: Statistics (3 units)
  - 3 Arts and Humanities courses
  - 3 Social/Behavioral Science, including Political Science 110: American Government & Politics equivalent, and CHDV 105: Introduction to Child Development equivalent (9 units)
  - 2 Physical and Biological Sciences courses (6 units)
  - 2 years of a foreign language in high school or 1 year at a community college
  - At least 1 CHDV elective course, though 2 courses are better (3-6 units)
  - · Remainder units can be a combination of elective courses to reach 37 transferrable units
- Student must hold a 3.0 GPA from all previous coursework at the point of admission into Whittier College to be considered for the PICES Program
- Must have taken CBEST prior to first semester at WC (\$41 paper-based; \$102 computer-based)
