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
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

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

The yield ratio (Enrolled/Accepted) increased from 11.6% to 16.8%



First-Year Students By Race/Ethnicity





First-Year Student State of Origin


The percent of first-year students from California in fall 2022 was 64%. The majority of entering students came from LA and Orange counties.






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Fall Enrollment Trends 15 Year History







Undergraduate Ethnicity and Minority Composition









Graduation Rates by Categories

Graduation Rates are typically reported at the six-year mark (i.e. 150% of time-tocompletion). As noted in chart and tables below, graduation rates vary by various subcategories - e.g. our most recent 6-year rate for Hispanic/Latino students was 68%. The national rate was 64% at 4-year schools and 68% at nonprofit schools.








